**SUMMARY:**

The subcommittee met during the main Impaired Driving Task Force meeting specifically to address possible draft recommendations to present to the group. After discussing, the group arrived at the following recommendations:

1. Having the state establish a baseline driving under the influence of drugs data prior to legalization, based on California Vehicle Code Sections 23152 and 23153 (including subsection) data.
2. Currently, there are no standardized reporting forms for collecting driving under the influence of drugs data. As such, the subcommittee recommends developing a standardized approach to collecting law enforcement (arrest), prosecution (case disposition), and laboratory results (scope of analysis).
3. Further invest in research to assess existing and to identify new measures to detect drug impaired driving.

The group then discussed the need to continue developing additional draft recommendations as the subcommittee continues to meet.
