BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Implemented January 1, 2016**
- **Performance-based inspection selection system replaced the previous time-based inspection selection system**
- **Incorporates scoring methodologies consistent with those used by Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, based on federal Safety Measurement System Behavioral Analysis and Safety Improvement Category (BASIC) percentiles**
- **Terminal inspection process unchanged**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Driver Records:**
 - **Employer Pull Notice**
 - **Driver timekeeping records**
 - **Driver proficiency records**
 - **Driver employment application**
- **Hazardous Materials (HM) Records:**
 - **HM training, cargo tank, shipping papers, and safety plan**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Maintenance Records:**
 - **Daily vehicle inspection reports**
 - **Preventive maintenance inspection reports**
 - **Documentation of all inspections*, maintenance, lubrication, and repair**

*** Includes carrier performed inspections required by Section 34505.5 of the California Vehicle Code (CVC)**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Inspection results are published on the CHP website**

Welcome to the Carrier Inspection Results Search

Per California Assembly Bill 529 Vehicles: Motor carriers: Inspections, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is required to provide the public with the outcome of terminal inspections performed in the State of California. This site provides searching parameters to find the carrier that may potentially own or uses a terminal within California. Carriers can be located outside of California, but, terminals must reside within California. Please use the search parameters provided to research the carrier for which you wish to view inspection results. Results of the search are returned, you may click on the Carrier (CA) / Motor Carrier Permit (MCP) number link and you will be redirected to that carrier's inspection results.

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Motor carriers transporting HM, having an HM Transportation License, or a Hazardous Waste Transporter Registration are subject to safety-performance scoring applicable to a HM transporting motor carrier.**
- **Safety-performance scoring considers all data collected during any inspection or enforcement contact by any federal, state, or local safety official.**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **All California terminals of the motor carrier will be selected for inspection when any one or more BASIC score, except the Crash Indicator BASIC, meets or exceeds the federal intervention level.**
- **All terminals will be selected for inspection when the Crash Indicator BASIC meets or exceeds a score of 90.**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

INSPECTION SELECTION

- **All terminals will be selected for inspection when the Crash Indicator BASIC meets or exceeds the federal intervention level, but does not exceed 89, when:**
 - **The BASIC score reaches/exceeds 90% of the federal intervention level in one or more of the following BASICs:**
 - **Unsafe Driving,**
 - **Hours-of-Service,**
 - **Driver Fitness, or**
 - **Controlled Substances and Alcohol**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Vehicles listed in Section 34500 CVC, subject to Section 34501.12 CVC, are as follows:**
 - **Prior to 1/1/2016:**
 - (a) **three axle trucks gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) > 10,000 pounds (lbs.)**
 - (b) **truck tractors**
 - (e) **trailers and semitrailers; pole, pipe, auxiliary, and logging dollies**
 - **used in combination with vehicles listed in subdivisions (a)-(d)**
 - (f) **combinations of motor trucks and (e) exceeding 40 feet in length**
 - (g) **vehicles transporting HM requiring placards or an HMTL**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

- **Vehicles listed in Section 34500 CVC, subject to Section 34501.12 CVC, are as follows:**
- **Effective 1/1/2016, BIT also includes:**
 - (j) **Any other motor truck not otherwise identified in Section 34500 CVC regulated by DMV, the PUG DCA (7/1/2018), or the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT)**
 - (k) **CMV with a GVWR of > 26,000 lbs. or a CMV towing a trailer in (e) with a GVWR of > 10,000 lbs.**

BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

Title 13, California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 1200. Scope. (prior to 10/1/2020)

(a) Applicability. Unless otherwise indicated within a specific section, the provisions of this chapter shall apply to vehicles listed in Vehicle Code Sections 545(k), 34500 and 34500.1 and their operation.

(b) Limited Application.

(1) Two-axle motor trucks with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less transporting hazardous materials in quantities for which placards are required pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 27903 shall be subject to the following Sections of this chapter: 1212, 1212.5, 1213, 1213.1, 1214, 1215, 1229, 1230, 1232, 1234, 1239, and 1256.

(2) Two-axle motor trucks with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less transporting hazardous materials in quantities for which placards are not required shall be subject to the following Sections of this chapter: 1212, 1212.5, 1214, 1215 (except 1215(b)), 1229, 1230, and 1232. Two-axle motortrucks transporting hazardous materials for which a license is required by Vehicle Code Section 32000.5 shall also be subject to Sections 1239 and 1256.

(3) Section 1213.1 Subsections (c) through (f), shall apply to drivers of commercial motor vehicles as defined in Vehicle Code Section 15210.

(4) Two-axle motor trucks described in subdivision (j) of Vehicle Code Section 34500 shall be subject only to Sections 1212, 1212.5, 1213, and 1239 (but only for matters relating to hours of service and logbooks of drivers) of this chapter.

(5) Persons operating vehicles which cause those persons to be subject to the Motor Carriers of Property Act as described in Division 14.85 of the Vehicle Code, but which vehicles are not included in Vehicle Code Section 34500, unless otherwise specified, shall be subject to Articles 6.5 and 7.5 of this chapter.

(c) Exceptions.

This chapter shall not apply to vehicles used primarily off the highway and not required to be registered pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 4000(a).



BASIC INSPECTION OF TERMINALS

Title 13, CCR, Section 1200. Scope. (effective 10/1/2020)

(a) Applicability. Unless otherwise indicated within a specific section, the provisions of this chapter shall apply to vehicles listed in Vehicle Code Sections 545(a)(11), 34500 and 34500.1 and their operation.

(b) Exceptions.

(1) This chapter shall not apply to vehicles used primarily off the highway and not required to be registered pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 4000(a).

(2) A vehicle identified in Vehicle Code Section 34500(g), otherwise not identified in subdivisions (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (h), (i), (j), and (k) of Vehicle Code Section 34500, is not subject to the provisions of this chapter, with the exception of Article 7.5, unless one or more of the following conditions exist:

(A) The display of placards is required pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 27903.

(B) A hazardous material transportation license is required pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 32000.5.

(C) A hazardous waste transporter registration is required pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 25163.
