FEDERAL TITLE VI NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE

It is the policy of the CHP, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the assurances set forth in the CHP's Title VI Program Compliance Plan to ensure that "no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, low income or limited English proficiency, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which CHP receives Federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation, including the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration." Furthermore, it shall be the policy of the CHP to ensure that as a recipient of Federal-aid funding, the CHP will ensure non-discrimination in all of its programs and activities, whether federally funded or not. The CHP is steadfast in its commitment to ensure the uniform adoption of this policy.

Further, the CHP's efforts to prevent discrimination will address, but not be limited to, a program's impact upon access, benefits, participation, treatment, services, contracting opportunities, training opportunities, and investigation of complaints.

In accordance with FMCSA regulations as required by Title 49, CFR Part 21 and Title 49, CFR Part 303, the CHP has developed procedures for processing and disposition of Title VI complaints. Any person believing the CHP or any of its sub-recipients has violated Title VI Program requirements in the administration of its programs or activities may file a complaint with the Department's Office of Equal Employment Opportunity (OEEO) or with the state Department of Fair Employment and Housing.

Overall responsibility for this policy is assigned to the Commissioner of the CHP located at 601 North 7th Street, Sacramento, CA 95811. The commander of the OEEO is appointed as the Title VI Coordinator, in coordination with affected CHP personnel, for the CHP and is responsible for the implementation of the Department's Title VI Program Compliance Plan.
