

## 2023 California Vehicle Theft Facts

#### **VEHICLE THEFTS**

- In 2023, 202,802 vehicles were stolen, at an estimated total value of \$1.8 billion.
   This is a 2.1 percent increase from the 2022 total for vehicle thefts statewide.
   The average rate of vehicle thefts in 2023 was approximately one vehicle every 2 minutes and 36 seconds with an average loss of \$8,876 per stolen vehicle.
- Of the 202,802 vehicles stolen in 2023, 44.2 percent were personal trucks and sport utility vehicles (SUV), 41 percent were automobiles, 5.8 percent were commercial trucks and trailers, and 4.3 percent were motorcycles. All other vehicles (e.g., recreational vehicles, construction and farm equipment, special construction) accounted for 4.7 percent of thefts.



#### WHERE THE THEFTS OCCURRED

- Approximately 51.7 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in Southern California (Los Angeles, San Diego, San Bernardino, Riverside, and Orange Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in Southern California, 59.8 percent occurred in Los Angeles County.
- Approximately 21.6 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in the San Francisco Bay Area (Alameda, Santa Clara, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Marin Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in the San Francisco Bay Area, 53.8 percent occurred in Alameda County.
- Approximately 11.9 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in the Central Valley (Kern, Fresno, San Joaquin, Tulare, Stanislaus, Merced, Kings, and Madera Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in the Central Valley, 36 percent occurred in Kern County.

 The remaining 14.8 percent of vehicle thefts occurred throughout the remainder of California.




#### **VEHICLE THEFT TRENDS**

- In 2023, for the second time, the top three stolen automobiles were:
  - 1. 2015 Kia Optima
  - 2. 2000 Honda Civic
  - 3. 1998 Honda Civic
- For the third consecutive year, the Chevy Silverado remained a vehicle of choice for thieves who continued targeting personal trucks/SUVs, specifically model years 2001, 2002, 2006, and 2004, which ranked one, two, and three, respectively.

- For the first time, 2022 and 2023 Honda ranked number one and two for the most frequently stolen motorcycles in 2023. The 2023 Kawasaki ranked number three.
- Freightliner commercial trucks model years 2016, 2015, and 2019 ranked number one, two, and three, respectively.
- Other vehicles include farm and construction equipment. In these categories,
  John Deere farm equipment has ranked as the number one brand of stolen
  farm equipment every year since 2008 and Unpublished Construction
  equipment is the number one brand of stolen construction equipment for 2023.
  These vehicles and equipment are popular targets because of their high resale
  value, popularity, and availability.

#### **VEHICLE RECOVERIES**

- Of the 202,802 vehicles stolen statewide in 2023, 85.8 percent were successfully recovered, representing 174,085 recovered vehicles.
- Of the 202,802 vehicles stolen statewide in 2023, 93.5 percent of the automobiles, 90.2 percent of the personal trucks and SUVs, 78.4 percent of the commercial trucks, and 55.7 percent of the motorcycles were recovered.
- Of the 174,085 vehicles recovered statewide in 2023, 51.7 percent were recovered intact and in drivable condition, 36.1 percent were intentionally burned and/or wrecked, 8.4 percent were stripped of minor parts, and 3.8 percent were missing major components.
- In 2023, it was determined 1,296 vehicles were stolen for the purpose of cargo theft. The total number of cargo thefts in California is low compared to overall vehicle thefts; however, the economic impact of cargo theft continues to soar and is considered an ongoing problem. Cargo theft is a crime frequently associated with organized retail crime. These thefts are detrimental to businesses statewide, the people of the State of California, and the overall economy.
