Program Purpose: To provide education, prevention, and enforcement of impaired driving laws related to driving under the influence of alcohol and other drugs, including cannabis.



Program Regulations

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) has adopted regulations within Title 13 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Division 2, by adding Chapter 13, which govern the CHP Cannabis Tax Fund Grant Program.

These regulations outline: grant provisions, grant project types, specific application requirements, grant evaluation criteria, and necessary administrative procedures for the program.

Toxicology Laboratory & Law Enforcement

<u>Project Funding</u> Toxicology: Approximate \$10 million with no funding cap per application

Law Enforcement: Approximate \$16 million with a \$1 million funding cap per application



Toxicology Eligible Applicants & Project Types

Eligible Applicants:

- California county and/or city crime laboratories
- Public laboratories supporting Driving Under the Influence (DUI)/Driving Under the Influence of Drugs (DUID) cases in California

Eligible Projects:

- Elimination of backlog in the analysis of forensic science evidence, including toxicology/forensic alcohol and controlled substances/drug chemistry for DUI and/or DUID prosecution
- Reduction in turnaround time for sample testing
- Purchasing and/or upgrading high-tech equipment to improve testing capabilities
- Reduction/Elimination of outsourcing for testing by private laboratories



Law Enforcement Eligible Applicants & Project Types

Eligible Applicants:

• City or county law enforcement agencies as defined in Section 830.1 of the California Penal Code, excluding Section 830.1(b)

Eligible Projects:

- Public education and outreach
- DUI/DUID enforcement efforts
- Officer Training focused on detecting and removing impaired drivers from the roadway



Eligible Costs

Eligible costs are costs that further the project objectives, incurred during the project performance period, and directly related to the work identified in the application.

Eligible cost categories:

- Personnel
- Travel
- Equipment
- Consultants/Contracts
- Other Direct Costs

GMS Application Sections



- Opportunity Details
 - Basic information on the opportunity type, funding and relevant dates
- Project Information
 - Requested funding amount and organization contact information
- Application Forms
 - Information on the proposed project, organization, and relevant data
- Budget
 - Eligible budget categories and definitions
- Performance Plan
 - Tracking of relevant project goals and activities
 - May or may not be required for all funding opportunities



Application Submission

Tips for successful submission of your application:

- Make sure all forms are "Marked as Complete"
- White check marks indicate forms are complete
- Review and download a copy for your records
- Once submitted, you will not be able to make any further charges or edits
- Application deadline is February 23, 2021 at 5:00 pm

Award Agreement

- Once application has been approved, the Grant Agreement will be sent to the address on file to be signed
 - The person with signing authority will sign the Agreement
 - Electronic or wet signature
 - Signature must match the name of the authority listed in the Application. If the authority changes, Grantee must send an email to CGU with the change
- Grantees will send signed Grant Agreements to CGU Grant Administrators electronically
- Once executed, Grant Administrators will electronically send each awarded Grantee a copy of the executed Grant Agreement



Reimbursement Process

- Disbursement of grant funds occurs on a reimbursement basis only.
 Payment advances will not be dispersed.
- Quarterly payment requests shall be submitted through the GMS within two weeks of the close of each quarter.
- Grant Administrators will review payment requests and supporting documentation, then submit to Accounts Payable once approved.
- Grant Administrators will contact the Administrative contact to resolve any issue with payment request.
- Approved payment requests will be paid within **45 days of receipt.**



Quarterly Reports

- To ensure grant funds are being spent correctly and efficiently, Grantees must show progress throughout the fiscal year utilizing quarterly progress reports.
- Quarterly progress reports must be submitted to CGU within **two weeks** after the close of each quarter.
- A form will be provided, however, Grantees may use their own quarterly report form.
- Quarterly reports may also include monitoring grant progress either by phone or with in person site visits.



Closeout Process

- The Department will conduct Closeout review activities prior to closing out the grant.
- Grantees shall submit a final payment request and required Closeout documentation through the GMS within **60 calendar days** after the completion of the project.
- A review of the final payment request and progress report will be conducted.
- A **closeout notification** will be issued in writing from the Department, and the final payment request will be processed.
