

VEHICLE THEFTS

- In 2022, 198,538 vehicles were stolen, at an estimated total value of \$1.76 billion. This is a 1.9 percent increase from the 2021 total for vehicle thefts statewide. The average rate of vehicle thefts in 2022 was approximately one (1) vehicle every three (3) minutes.
- Of the 198,538 vehicles stolen in 2022, 48.2 percent were personal trucks and sport utility vehicles (SUV), 36.6 percent were automobiles, 6.2 percent were commercial trucks and trailers, and 5.1 percent were motorcycles. All other vehicles (e.g., recreational vehicles, construction and farm equipment, special construction) accounted for 3.9 percent of thefts.

WHERE THE THEFTS OCCURRED

- Approximately 53.5 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in Southern California (Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and San Diego Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in Southern California, 58.2 percent occurred in Los Angeles County.
- Approximately 18 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in the San Francisco Bay Area (Alameda, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Santa Clara Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in the San Francisco Bay Area, 44.8 percent occurred in Alameda County.

- Approximately 12.5 percent of all vehicle thefts occurred in the Central Valley (Kern, Fresno, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Tulare, Merced, Madera, and Kings Counties). Of the vehicle thefts in the Central Valley, 36.5 percent occurred in Kern County.
- The remaining 16 percent of vehicle thefts occurred throughout the remainder of California.



VEHICLE THEFT TRENDS

- In 2022 the top three stolen automobiles were:
 - 1. 2015 Kia Optima (for the first time)
 - 2. 2000 Honda Civic (sixth consecutive year being in the top 3)
 - 3. 1998 Honda Civic (eighth consecutive year being in the top 3)
- For the second consecutive year, the Chevy Silverado remained a vehicle of choice for thieves who continued targeting personal trucks/SUV, specifically model years 2001, 2002, and 2004, which ranked one, two, and three, respectively.
- For the fourth consecutive year, the 2015 and 2016 Yamaha ranked number one and two respectively, for the most frequently stolen motorcycles. The 2022 Honda ranked number three.

- Freightliner commercial trucks model years 2016, 2014, and 2015 ranked number one, two, and three, respectively.
- Other vehicles include farm and construction equipment. In these categories, John Deere farm equipment has ranked as the number one brand of stolen farm equipment every year since 2008 and Bobcat Company is the number one brand of stolen construction equipment for 2022. These vehicles and equipment are popular targets because of their high resale value, popularity, and availability.

VEHICLE RECOVERIES

- Of the 198,538 vehicles stolen statewide in 2022, 86.7 percent were successfully recovered, representing 172,083 recovered vehicles.
- Of the 198,538 vehicles stolen statewide in 2022, 94 percent of the automobiles, 92.1 percent of the personal trucks and SUVs, 80.2 percent of the commercial trucks, and 56.1 percent of the motorcycles were recovered.
- Of the vehicles 172,083 vehicles recovered statewide in 2022, 56.5 percent were recovered intact and in drivable condition, 29.6 percent were intentionally burned and/or wrecked, 10 percent were stripped of minor parts, and 3.8 percent were missing major components.
- In 2022, it was determined 43 of the recovered vehicles were stolen for the purpose of cargo theft. Representing less than half a percent, the total number of cargo thefts in California is low compared to overall vehicle thefts; however, the economic impact of cargo theft continues to soar and is considered an ongoing problem. Cargo theft is a crime frequently associated with organized retail crime, with a reported loss value in excess of \$54 million. These thefts are detrimental to businesses statewide, the people of the State of California, and the overall economy.
