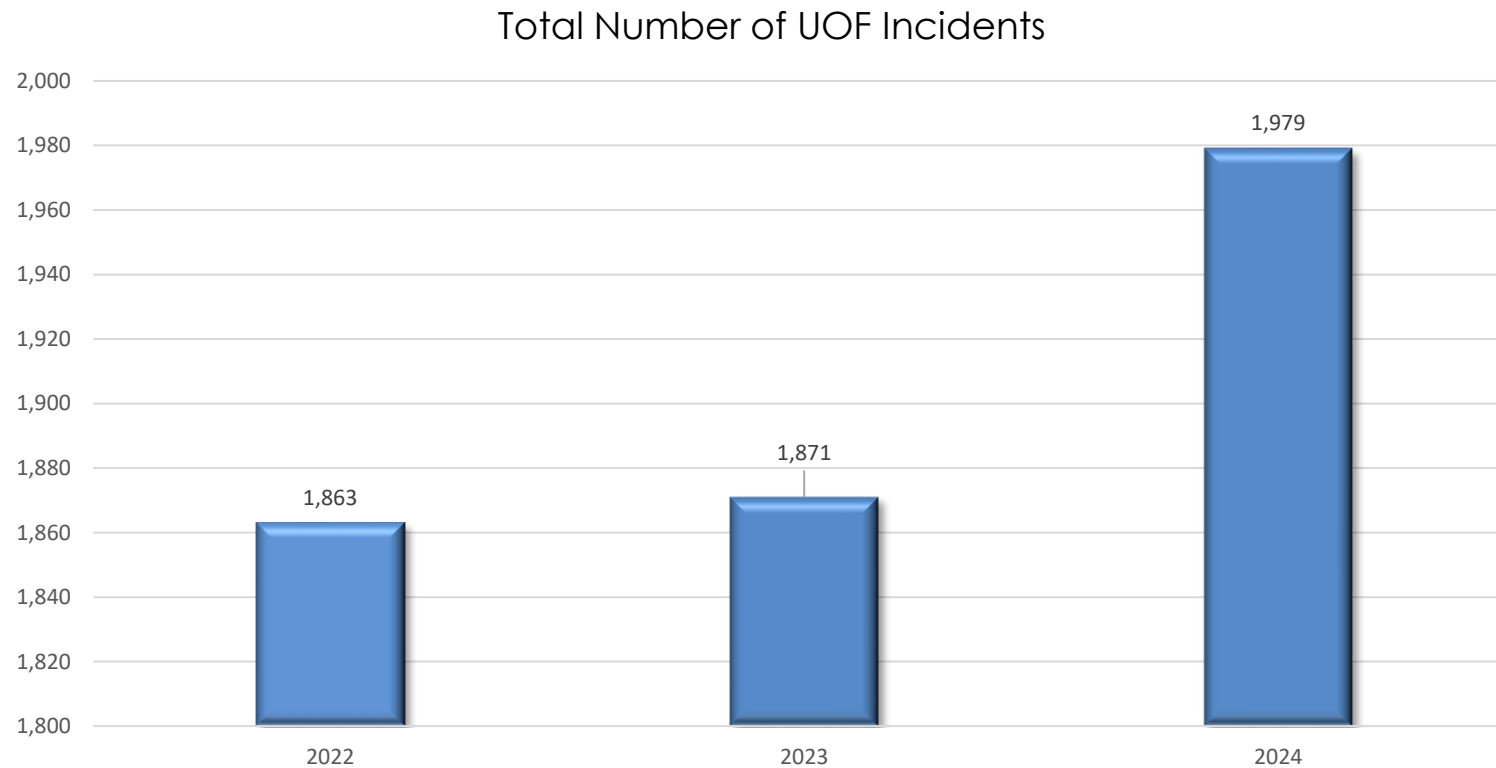

2024 Executive Summary

Overview

There were a total of 1,979 Use of Force (UOF) incidents reported in 2024, which is a 5.8 percent increase from 2023. In 2023, there were 1,871 reported UOF incidents. The following chart represents the number of UOF incidents.



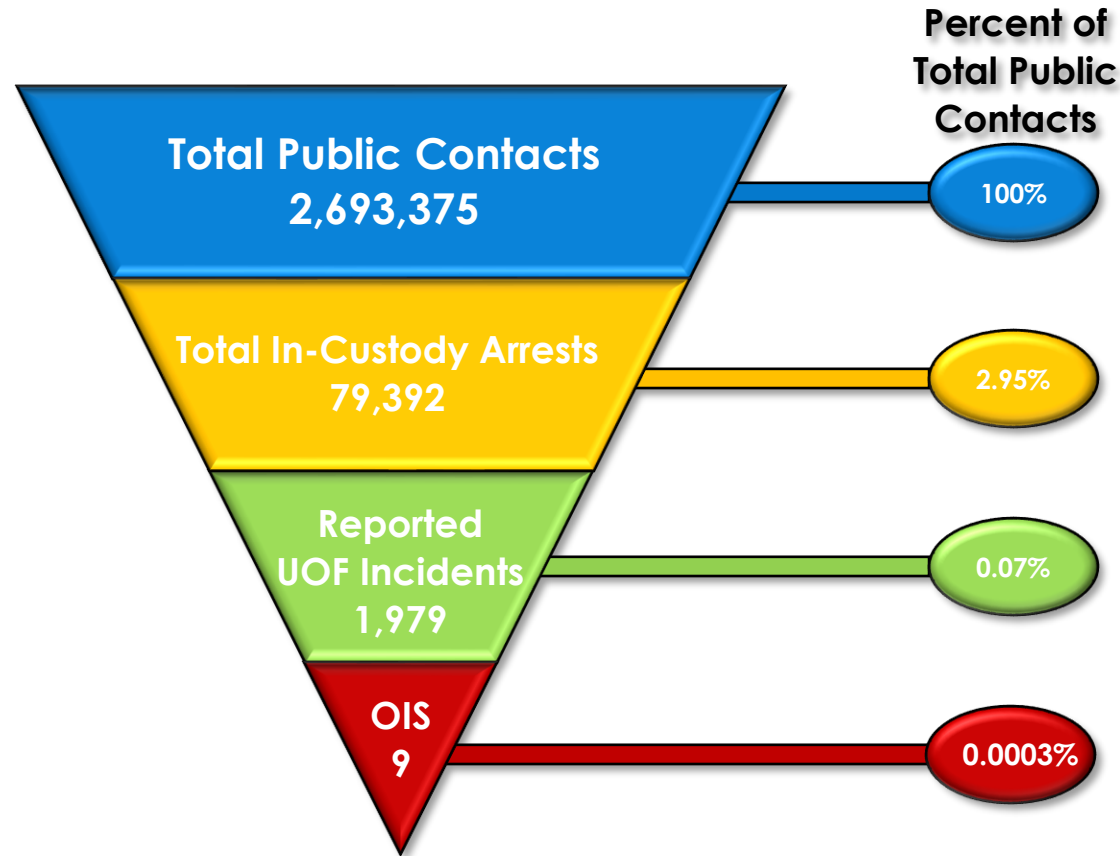

Public Contacts and UOF Incidents

In 2024, the Department had 2,693,375 estimated public contacts, including vehicle and pedestrian stops, traffic crashes, motorist services, and other contacts. From the total documented public contacts, the CHP made 79,392 in-custody arrests and were involved in 1,979 UOF incidents. De-escalation techniques were utilized in 1,809 of the UOF incidents. Of the reported UOF incidents, 10 were classified as Deadly Force, of which 9 were officer involved shooting (OIS) incidents.

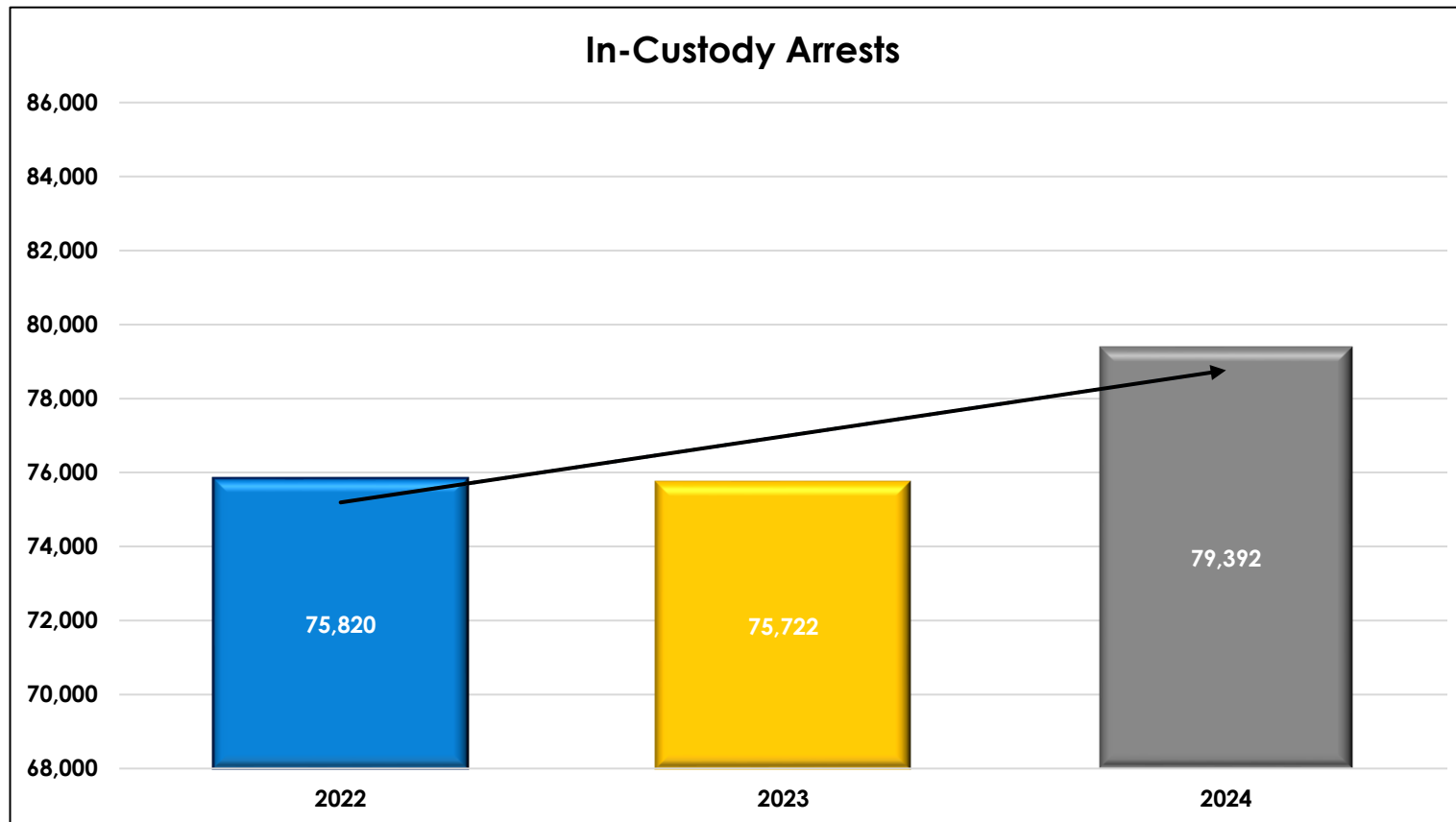
**1,979 Total

In-Custody Arrests

The comparative analysis of UOF incidents in relation to the total number of in-custody arrests made by CHP officers illustrates a fractional rise in reported UOF occurrences. The findings of this analysis show a UOF occurred in 2.49 percent of the 79,392 in-custody arrests made, which further breaks down to one UOF incident for every 40 in-custody arrests in 2024.

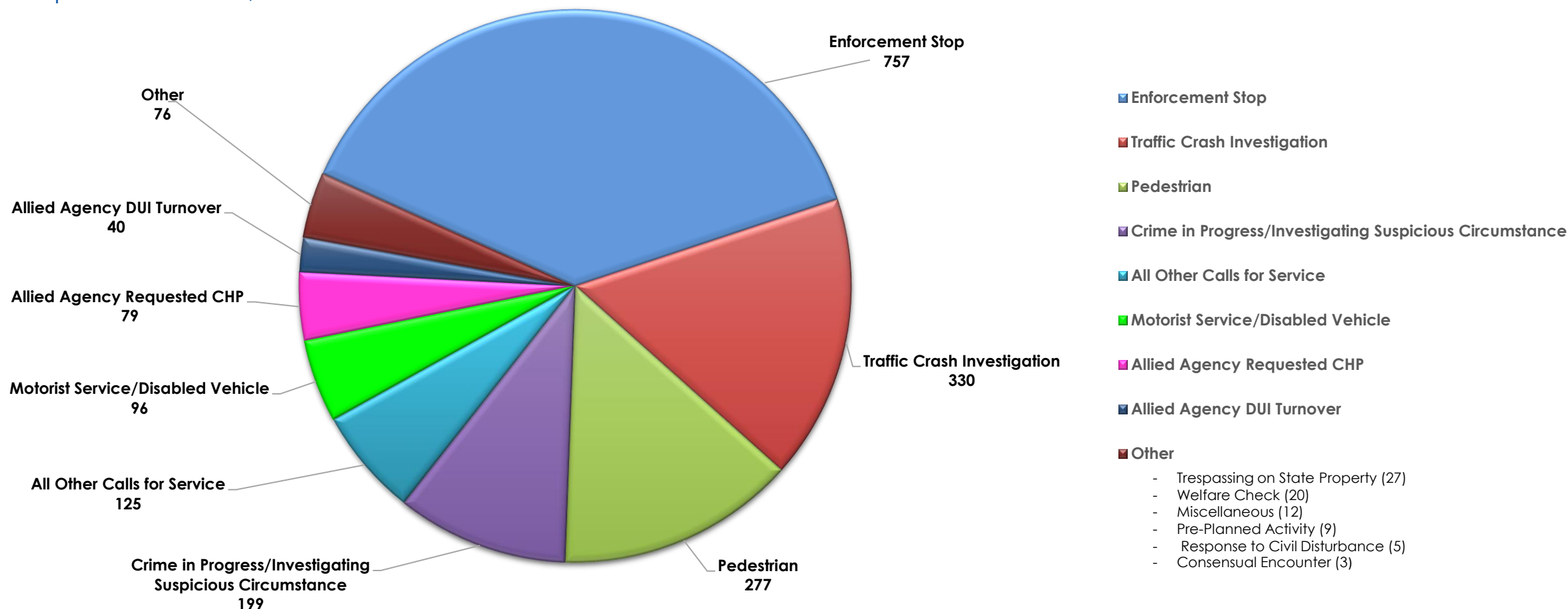




2024 Executive Summary

Reason for Contact

In 2024, enforcement stops were the primary reason for a public contact which resulted in a use of force. There were 757 enforcement stops (including allied agency-initiated enforcement stops) that led to a reported UOF incident, or approximately 38.3 percent of the 1,979 UOF incidents.

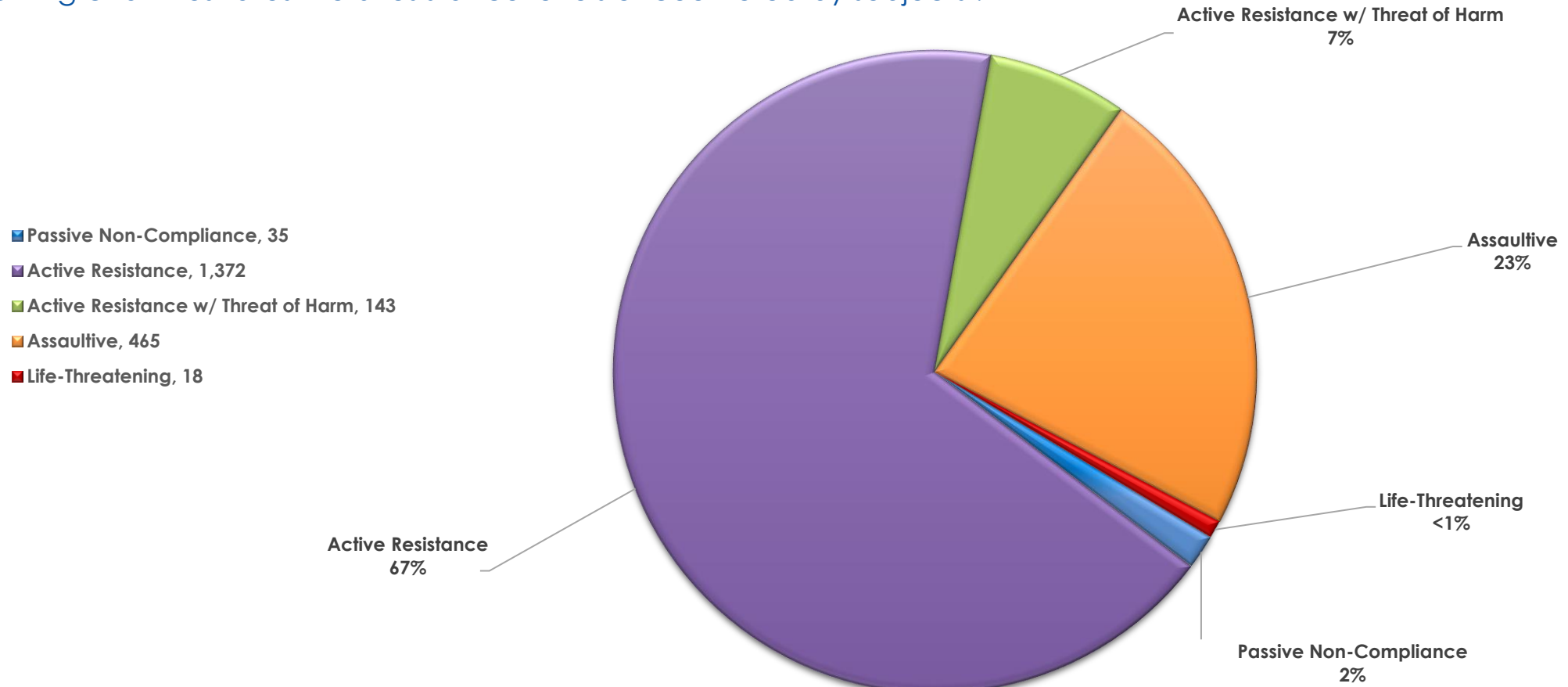

Resistance Type

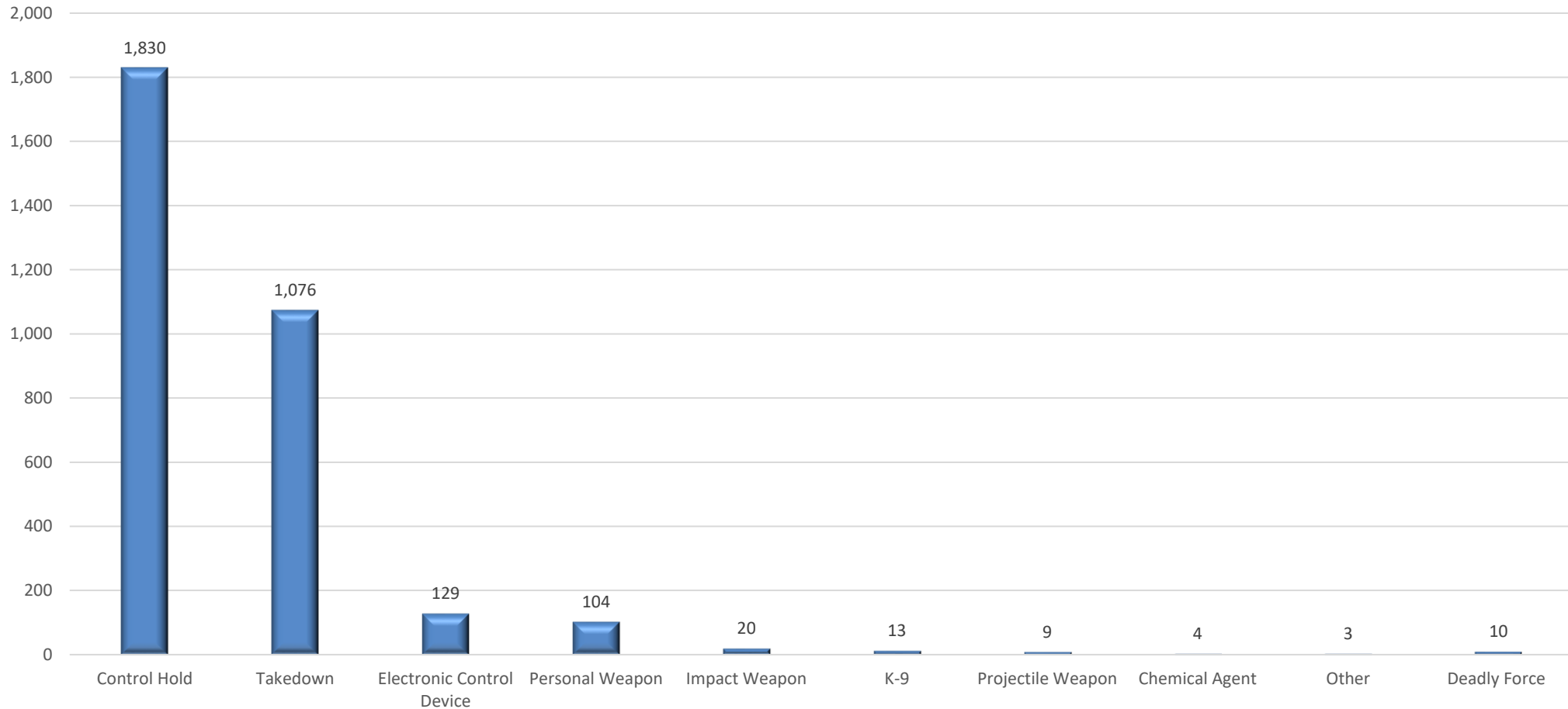
The following chart illustrates the 6 resistance levels encountered by subjects .





UOF Incident Types and De-escalation

There were 1,979 UOF incidents. CHP utilized a de-escalation technique in 1,809 (91.4 percent) of the incidents. One or more UOF type can be selected for each incident.



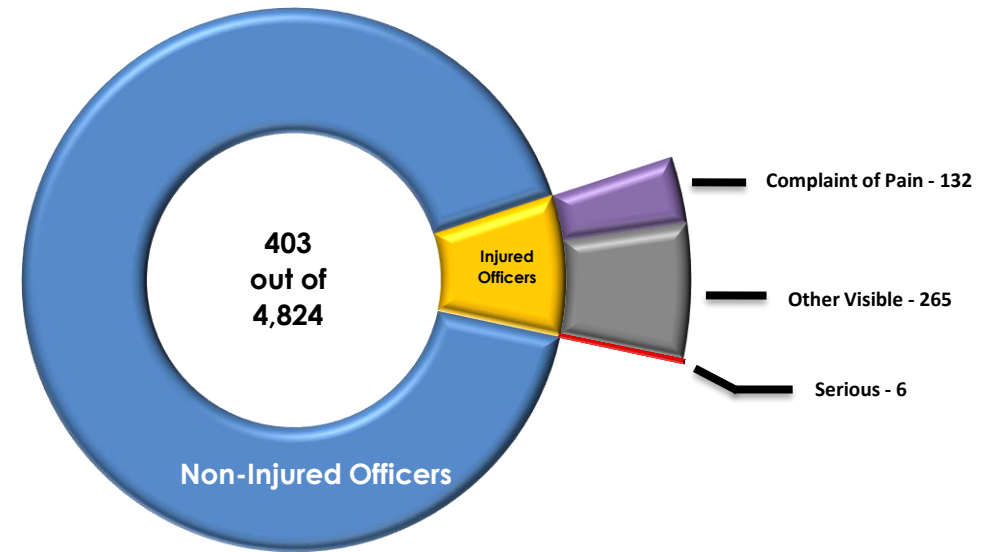
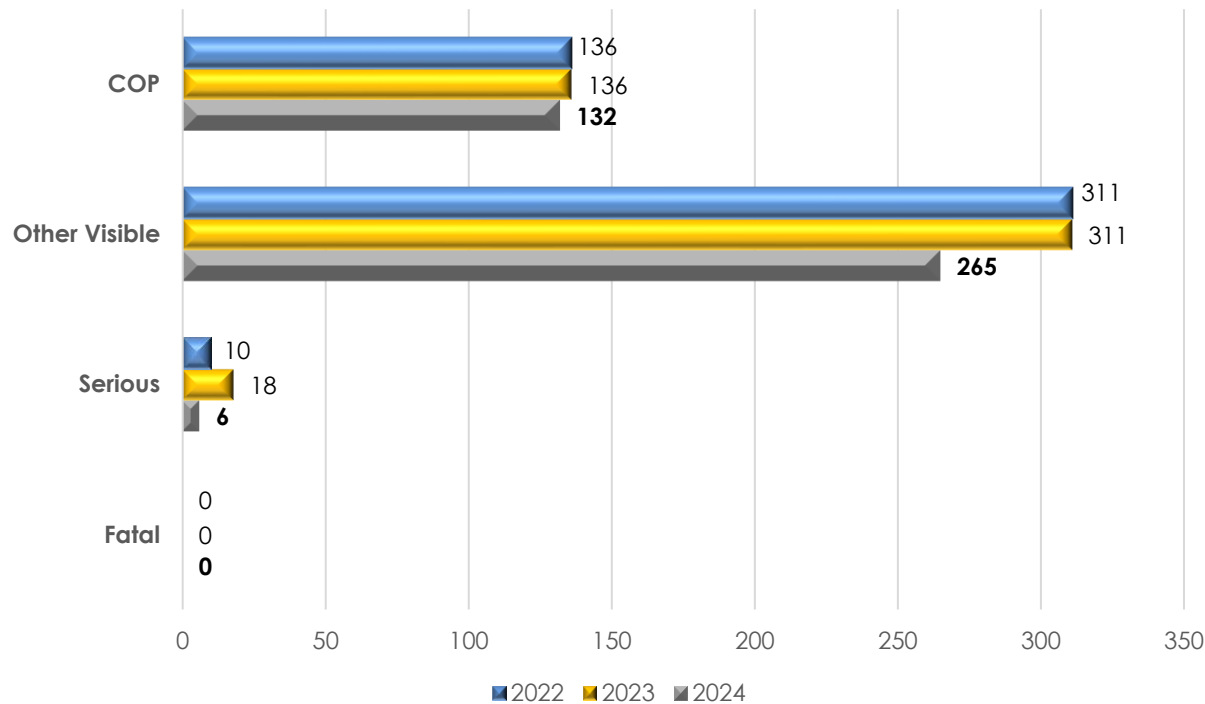

Officer Injuries

337 (17.0 percent) UOF incidents resulted in an injury to an officer which resulted in 403 officers sustaining an injury during a UOF incident.

Officer Injury Severity by Year



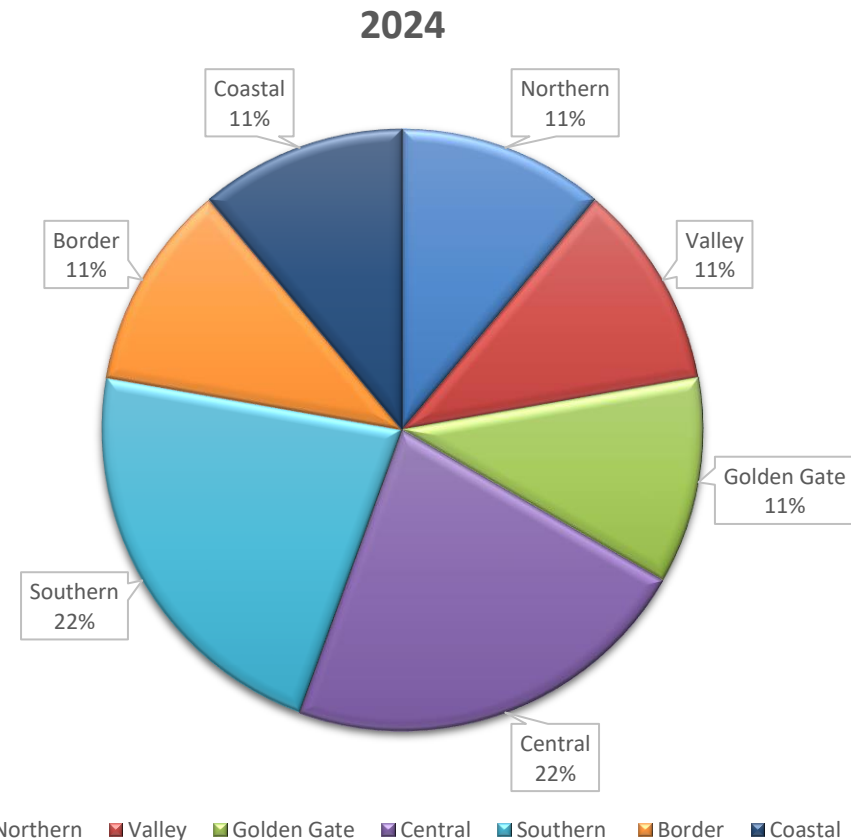

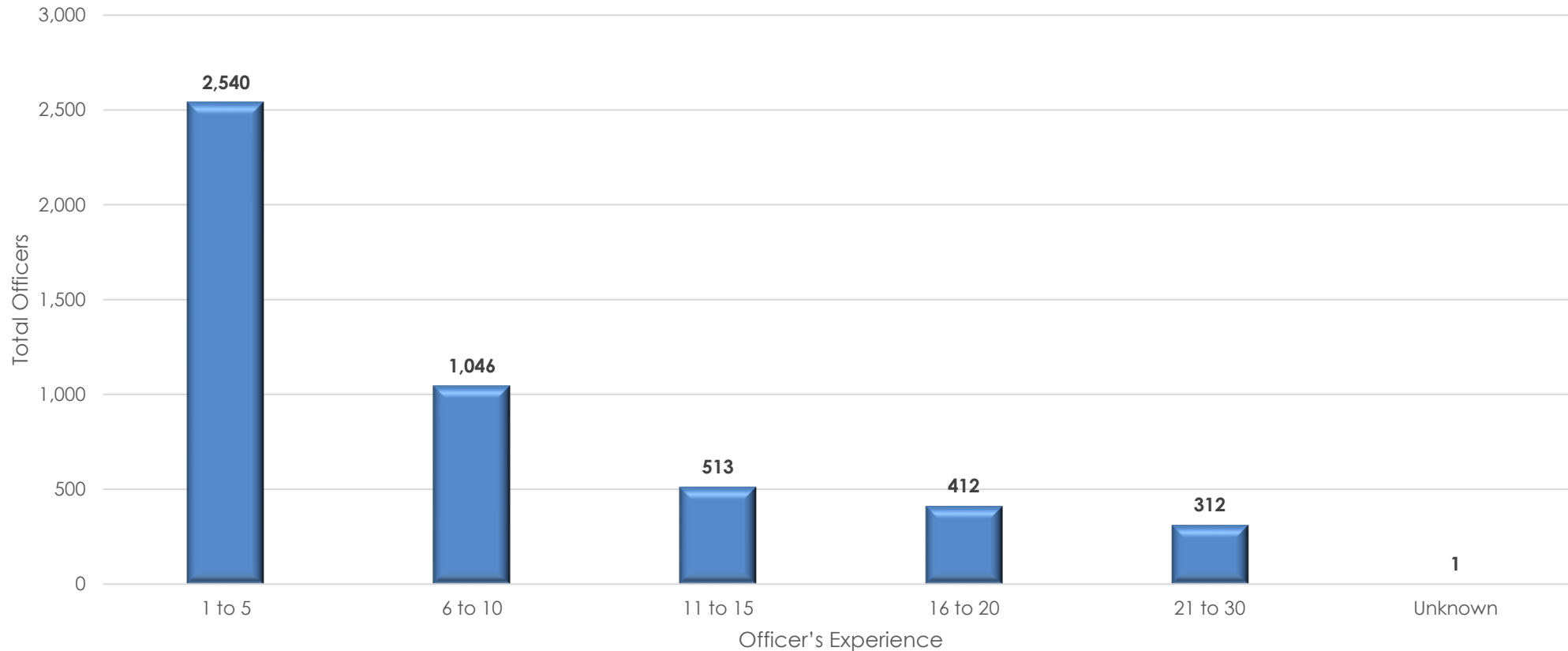

Officer's Experience

Officers with 1-5 years of law enforcement experience accounted for 52.7 percent of the officers involved in departmental UOF incidents. One officer that used force was not identified, therefore their experience is unknown.

Crowd Control

On May 1, 2024, CHP was requested to assist UCLA Police with a Civil Disturbance. 240 officers were reporting as involved in crowd control efforts. Of those officers, 65 officers were reported to have used force on 29 subjects. 10 officers were reported to have utilized projectile weapons, with 33 rounds of 12-Gauge Shotgun with Kinetic Energy Munitions and 24 rounds of 40MM Direct Impact Sponge rounds deployed during the incident.
