



Drug Recognition Expert Instructor School Application

California's Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) program leads the country with the largest number of certified DREs. Much of this success can be attributed to the quality and guidance given by California DRE Instructors during the classroom instruction and field certification processes. Because of the highly technical nature of the functions performed by the DRE, only persons experienced in the techniques of drug influence evaluations should become instructors in the DRE program.

Due to class size, the needs of the State, and quality of the DRE program, not all applicants are accepted. The DRE State Coordinator shall make the final determination as to whether a candidate shall be accepted into training as a DRE Instructor.

ACADEMIC TRAINING: DRE Instructor classroom training is conducted over two consecutive days (16 hours). Candidate instructors are required to attend all sessions. Students will be assigned a DRE School Session one week before the course and expected to present that session on the first day of this course. Students must achieve a minimum of 80% on two written examinations (pre-test and final) and must demonstrate proficiency and a profound knowledge of the DRE curriculum in all practical exercises in order to progress to the certification phase.

CERTIFICATION PHASE: After successfully completing the academic portion, students are required to instruct for a minimum of two hours at a DRE school and supervise the administration of not less than two drug influence evaluations performed by candidate DRE's at an approved certification training site; all while under the supervision of a certified DRE Instructor. Scheduling for the DRE School and certification sites is done at the discretion of the DRE State Coordinator's office (Impaired Driving Section- IDS).

The International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) and the California DRE State Coordinator regulate and certify California's DRE program. DRE Instructor certification is valid as long as the standards for DRE recertification are maintained and the Instructor additionally instructs a minimum of eight hours at a DECP class or supervises at least ten evaluations at an authorized DRE certification training site every two years. An Instructor may be decertified if they do not participate in drug recognition course instruction, demonstrate evidence of inadequate or improper performance, inconsistent findings, or other substantiated acts on the part of the instructor that brings discredit on the Drug Evaluation & Classification Program.

You must be a currently certified DRE by the State of California with a minimum of two years of experience. You must also be a Standardized Field Sobriety Testing Instructor. Two California certified DRE Instructors must recommend you by sending an email to DRE@chp.ca.gov. One of which must be a DRE Instructor Mentor as recognized by the DRE State Coordinator's Office and the other a member of IDS. The State Coordinator may provide exceptions to this requirement. You must also submit a copy of your DRE rolling log, be up to date in the National/State Tracking Systems and submit a copy of your updated curriculum vitae. Incomplete and/or inaccurate applications, or applications without the required supporting documents, **WILL NOT** be considered.

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) has been designated as the statewide DECP coordinator for the State of California. The resources coordinated by the CHP on a statewide basis assists the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in the expansion of the DECP to other states as well as within California by providing training in drug detection to law enforcement personnel.
