# Electronic Bypass Management Systems (EBMS)

- Two vendors are authorized in California
  - PrePass
  - Drivewyze
  - Both are here at CVSS (see vendor tables)
  - Neither is endorsed by the California Highway Patrol (CHP)
- Contracts with CHP stipulate pull-in rates in accordance with Inspection Selection System value, and if registered as carrier of Haz-Mat/Haz-Waste

#### **Current Technology at Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Facilities (CVEF)**

- EBMS
- Weigh-in-Motion
- License Plate Readers
- Cameras
- Radiological

- USDOT Number Readers
- Oversize/Over width/Over height sensors
- Tire Anomaly Classification System (TACS)





#### **\*\*\*To avoid unnecessary inspections\*\*\***

- Detect violations amongst all commercial motor vehicles (CMV) entering CVEFs
- Rapidly locate violations and remove more unsafe vehicles from roadway to prevent crashes
- Expedite the flow of traffic through CVEFs
- Minimize time spent waiting in queues at CVEFs
- Reduce emissions of commercial motor vehicles while operating on California roadways



#### Future of Electronic Screening at CHP

- Expanded implementation of TACS
- Looking into other technologies that have become available (brake anomaly sensors)
- "Virtual" CVEFs to assist CHP Mobile Road Enforcement officers who work away from mainline freeways
  - Provide access to same technologies as large, fixed CVEFs to locate violations before they result in a crash
